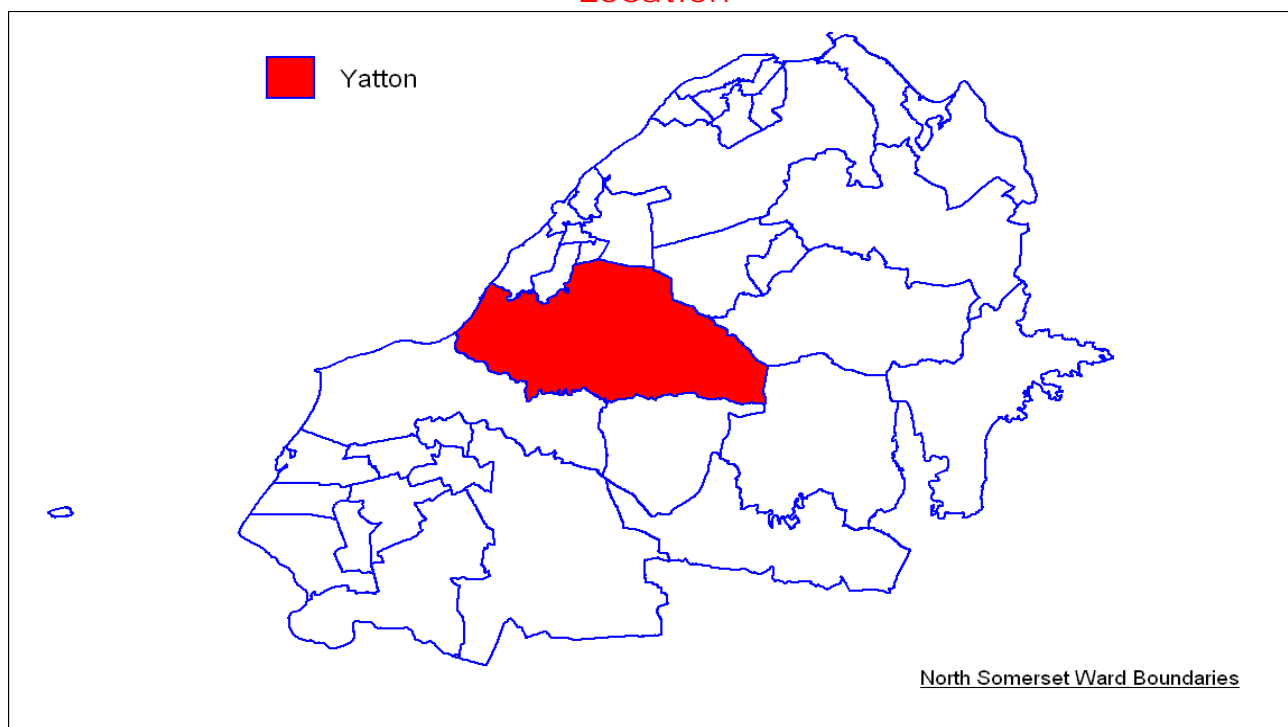


# Yatton ward profile

## Location

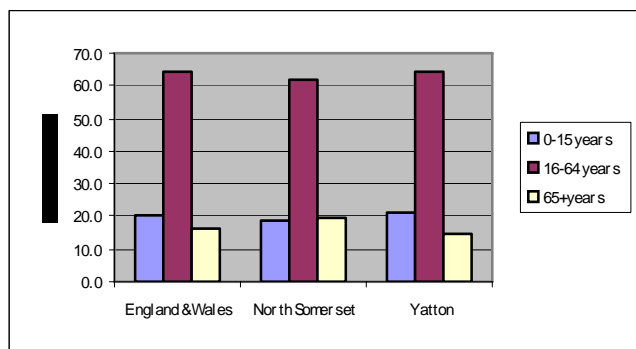


## Key facts

- The geographical size of Yatton is 3711 hectares.
- The population of Yatton accounts for 5% of the population across the whole of North Somerset.
- The average age of the population of Yatton is 39.3 years.
- The average life expectancy for the residents of Yatton is 78.9 years.

## Population

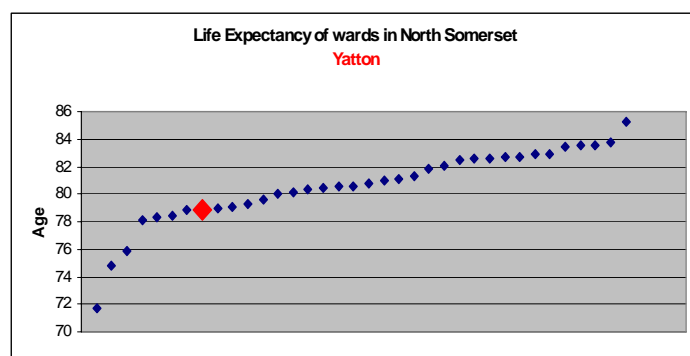
- The total population of Yatton is 9176 people.
- 49% of the population are male and 51% are female.
- 1937 people (21%) are 0-15 years old.
- 5860 people (64%) are 16-64 years old.
- 1379 people (15%) are 65 years old and over.
- This profile is almost identical to the England and Wales breakdown of the population.

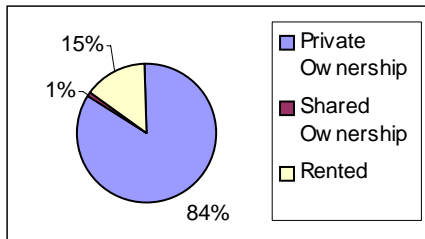
## Health

- 15.1% of the population of Yatton are described as having a limiting long term illness.
- 73% consider themselves to be in good health.
- 20% feel that they are in fairly good health.
- 7% do not think that they are in good health.
- Average life expectancy in Yatton is 78.9 years compared to 79.96 across North Somerset.

## Housing



- 16% more dwellings in Yatton are in private ownership than in England and Wales.
- There are 94% houses and 6% flats in Yatton.
- 12 new dwellings were completed here during 2005/06, less than 1% of the total new homes in North Somerset.

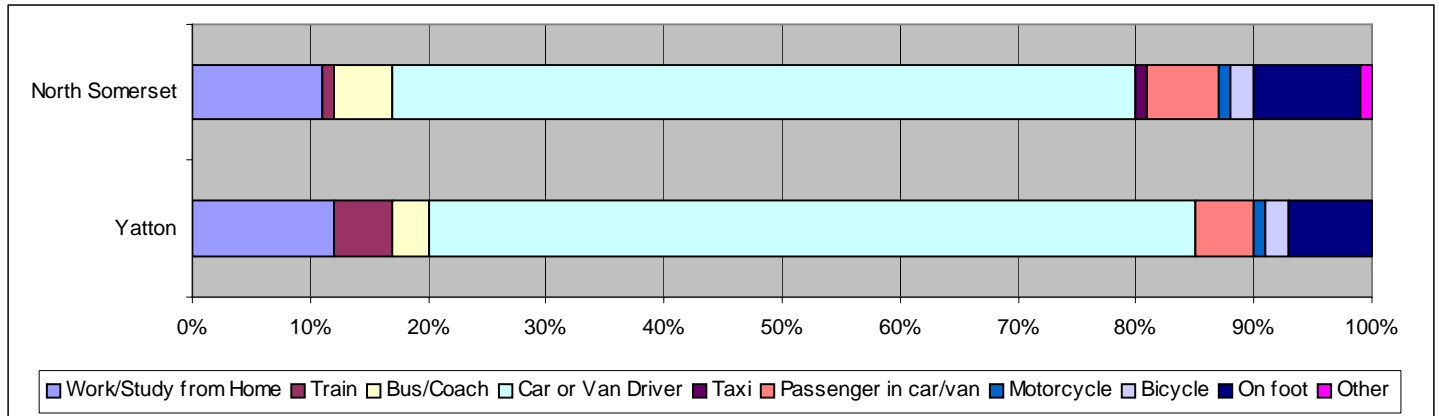

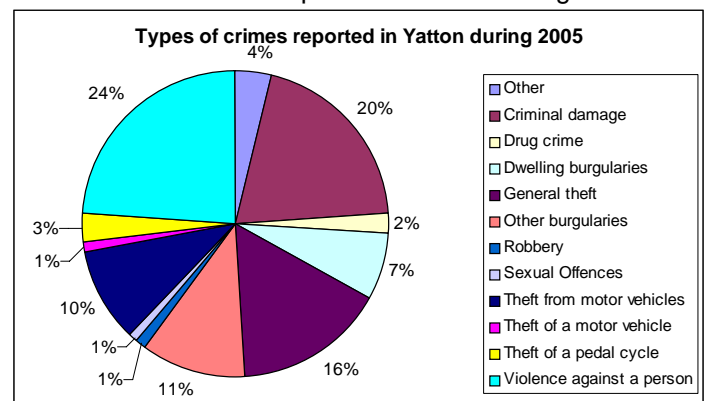
## Education

- 70% of the 3 year olds in Yatton in 2005 attended a pre-school or nursery class.
- In 2005, 67.3% of the GCSE students achieved 5+ A\*-C grades. This figure is up 3.6% since the 2004 results.
- 22.4% of the working age population of Yatton are qualified to degree level or above.
- 19.5% of the working age population of Yatton do not have any qualifications.
- There are three schools in Yatton, Court de Wyck C of E Primary, Yatton C of E Infants and Yatton C of E Juniors.

## Deprivation

There are six super output areas in Yatton. The areas around Mendip Road (1) North Yatton and Cleeve (2) and Kingston Seymour (3) are between the average and the least deprived 25% of areas in the country. The area around the train station (4) the Stowey Road area (5) and Claverham (6) are within the least deprived 25% of areas nationally.

## Population

All of the data used in this section is sourced from the 2001 Census.

## Deprivation

All of the information used in this section is sourced from the Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2004.

Super Output Areas (SOAs) are small geographical areas that fit inside ward boundaries. These small areas are much more useful for identifying the pockets of deprivation that can be overlooked if the data is only studied at ward level.

Boundaries for the super output areas are available on request from the Research and Monitoring Team.

## Housing

All of the information used in this section is sourced from the 2001 Census and the North Somerset Residential Land Survey April 2006, published by the Research and Monitoring Team.

## Employment and unemployment

All of the data in this section is sourced from the 2001 Census.

For the economic activity statistics 'working age' refers to males aged 16 to 64 years and females aged 16 to 59 years.

## Transport

All of the data in this section is sourced from the 2001 Census Travel to Work statistics.

## Health

The information in this section has been sourced from the 2001 Census and the life expectancies have been provided by North Somerset Primary Care Trust (PCT).

## Education

All of the data for this section has been provided by North Somerset Council Education department and the Department for Education and Skills (DfES).

## Crime

The crime statistics have been provided by Avon and Somerset Constabulary and relate to all incidents reported during 2005. It must be noted that these cannot be guaranteed to be the actual figures of crime incidents occurring as some may go unreported.
