Summary of the proposed variation to the licence:

Amendment to wording on Condition 3 and 9 under Prevention of Public Nuisance objective.
Previously stating:

While live or recorded music is being played at the premises, noise levels shall be monitored

All noise complaints (including time, date, address, and contact number) shall be recorded and any remedial actions taken by the competent person to prevent nuisance. The record shall be made available to North Somerset Council upon request.

To change to:

While live or recorded music is being played at the premises, noise levels shall be monitored and submitted to the Licensing Authority within 14 days of the event

All noise complaints (including time, date, address, and contact number) shall be recorded and any remedial actions taken by the competent person to prevent nuisance. The record shall be submitted the Licensing Authority within 14 days of the event
