

Heritage Action Zone (HAZ) - Memories Shared Volunteer

Library Service

Purpose of the role:

As part of the Heritage Action Zone Project, to help run 20 Memories Shared Reminiscence sessions between October 2022 and December 2023. These sessions aim to:

- Have a positive impact on the health and well-being of older people, including those living with dementia and memory loss;
- · Reduce isolation, social exclusion and loneliness;
- Begin to break down barriers to technology for older people.

Main tasks and activities may include:

- Running events in group settings e.g. Care Homes, Memory Cafes;
- Showing people how to use the Memories Shared tablets and view the photographs;
- Encouraging people to reminisce and share their memories with others in the group.

Volunteers will have these qualities, skills and experiences:

You do not need to have any previous experience of volunteering or working in a library. For this role you will need:

- An interest in libraries and desire to be an advocate for the service;
- Good conversation skills:
- To be reliable:
- To enjoy meeting new people;
- To be calm and patient;
- To be familiar with using the tablets (full training will be given but prior knowledge of using an iPad would be useful).

Types of training and resources available to support volunteers:

- An Induction which explains how the library service operates and outlines all the policies and procedures that you will need to know;
- A tour of the library at which you will be volunteering;
- Details of any resources available to help you in your volunteering role;
- Dementia Friends, and role-specific training;
- Introductions to members of staff and other volunteers, alongside whom you will be volunteering;
- Out of pocket expenses can be paid;
- Accreditation may also be available.

How often does the volunteer activity tend to take place?

We are funded to deliver 20 sessions between October 2022 and December 2023, which means we aim to run at least 1 session per month, but sessions may not be regular. Volunteers will be contacted about their availability. We are hoping that at the end of the funded project we can work with our volunteers to discuss how best to expand the project and take it forward

Where does the voluntary activity take place?
